

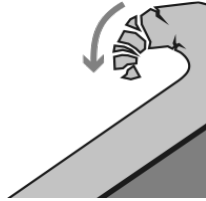

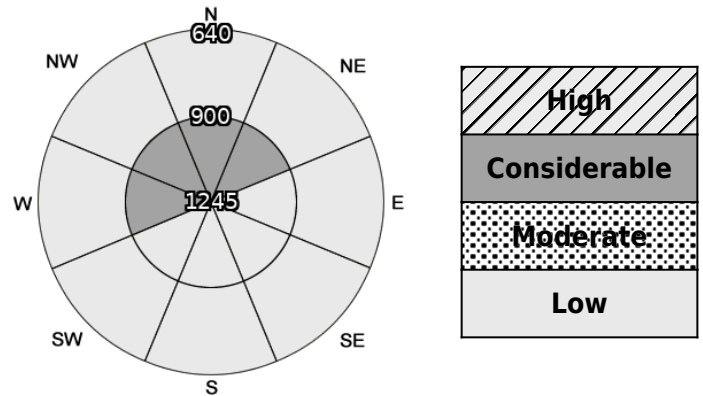

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow with unstable windslab accumulations becoming more widespread on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 800 metres. Very wind sheltered coire rims, ridge crests, gully exits and crag aprons will be most affected. Unstable cornices also on these aspects. Deep isolated accumulations will also present be at lower elevations in steep banks and hollows. Many areas will be scoured and bare, especially where wind exposed. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Storm force South-South-Westerly winds continuing throughout the day, with some lessening in strength in the afternoon. Freezing level around 1000m overnight lowering to 500 metres early morning rising to 700 in afternoon. Precipitation, sometimes heavy snow overnight becoming showery during the day, snow down to 200m at day break, rising to 600 metres.
