

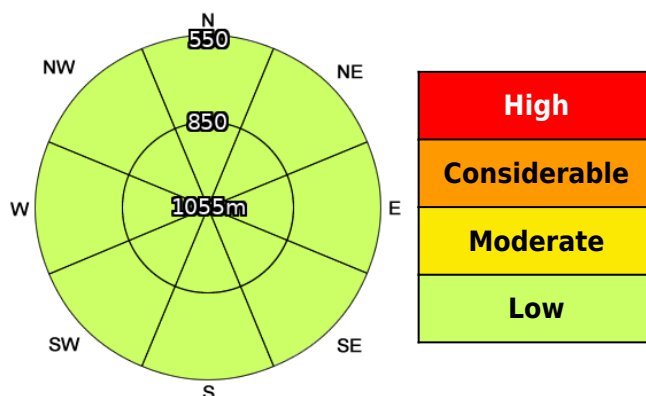

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 24/01/2020

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old limited and patchy snowpack will be well bonded and stable. Most snow remains on North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres, particularly gully tops, coire rims and ridge flanks. There will be a dusting of new snow on the highest tops, however this is not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong Westerly winds will back and become fresh South-Westerly. Light showers overnight and during the afternoon will be snow on the highest tops. The freezing level will fall to 700 metres during the morning before rising above the summits again in the afternoon.
