




Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 24/01/2020

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a light dusting of new snow at the highest levels. The old snowpack will become much firmer in the cooler temperatures. Greatest amounts are on Northerly to Easterly aspects above 950 metres mostly around corrie rims and back walls. Elsewhere the ground will be mostly clear of snow with some patches remaining on the plateau also shallow gullies and hollows at lower altitudes. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light drizzle and summit snow is expected during the night, this will clear leaving a dry day with some hill fog. Winds will be moderate to strong and generally Westerly in direction. The freezing level will lower to 900 metres in the night before rising again through the afternoon to above the summits.

Comments

Fluctuating temperatures over the next 24 hours, a mild windy start to the weekend turning cooler on Sunday.
