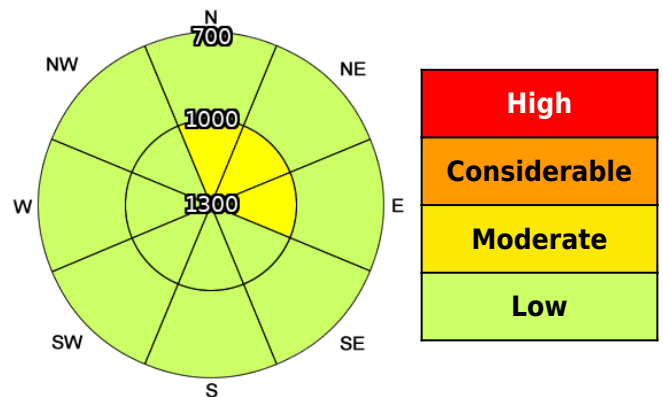
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised deposits of weakly bonded windslab will overlie the old icy and firm snowpack present on North, North-East and East aspects above 1000 Metres. Wind sheltered locations such as corrie rims, headwalls and gully tops will be affected. Outwith these areas the thin dusting of snow will lie on bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A cold day expected with snow showers overnight providing new snow. Further snow showers are expected during the day. Winds will be West-South-Westerly backing to South-Westerly by the end of the day. The wind will be gale force overnight before dropping to strong from midday.
