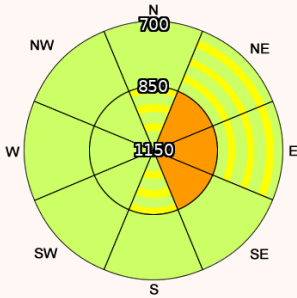


**Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Tue 11/02/2020 TO 18:00HRS Wed 12/02/2020**



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
<b>Very High</b>	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
<b>High</b>	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
<b>Considerable</b>	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
<b>Moderate</b>	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
<b>Low</b>	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

New snow mainly overnight will become showery through the day. Westerly winds will be strong overnight and at start of the day becoming fresh by end of the day. The freezing level will be around 300 metres.

**Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard**

New snow and wind transport of existing deposits will continue to form unstable windslab in wind sheltered areas, greatest accumulations will be present in gullies and on North-East to South-Easterly aspects mainly above 850 metres. Other areas may be affected by cross loading. Fragile cornices will be above many of these aspects. Windward slopes will remain scoured and be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Observed Avalanche Hazard - Tue 11/02/2020**

**Observed Weather Influences**

New snow falling as squally showers and strong Westerly winds continue to affect the area, the freezing level is around 700 metres

**Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard**

Unstable accumulations of windslab exist in sheltered summit gullies and on slopes with a North through East to South-East aspect mainly above 850 metres, most other windward slopes are scoured and are generally stable. The avalanche hazard is Considerable.

**Mountain Conditions**

**Observed Mountain Travel Conditions**

Windward slopes are scoured and icy in places drifted snow lies mainly on Easterly aspects, Poor visibility in clouds and snow afternoon. Winds 30 mph mainly Westerly.

**Comments**

Not so wild tomorrow with lighter winds and less snow forecast through the day.
