





Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will remain, mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 650 metres. Wind sheltered locations such as gullies, coire rims and crag aprons will be most affected. Additional windslab deposits will be present on isolated steep slopes at lower levels mainly above 500 metres. Other aspects will be affected due to cross loading. Slopes exposed to the recent strong winds will be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.





Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a dry day with the freezing level around 200 metres. Moderate strength South-West winds backing East-North-East during the morning then backing North-West by the end of the day.
