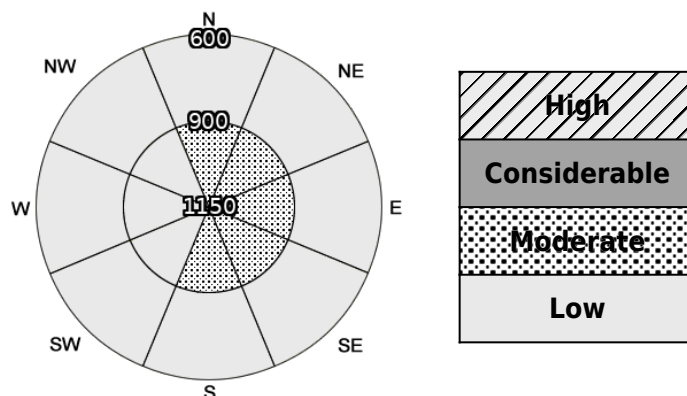

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to develop mainly on North-East to South-East aspects with lesser amounts on North and South aspects. Greatest accumulations will be found above 900 metres in steep wind sheltered locations such as gully exits and around corrie rims. Localised pockets of shallow windslab will also be found at lower altitudes. Many plateau areas and exposed ridges will be scoured and icy. Cornices will also continue to develop. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold with occasional very light snow showers. Winds will initially be from the South-West and strong but veer and strengthen slightly to the West-North-West by the end of the day.
