

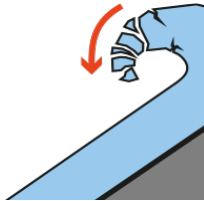
## THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE

#### Avalanche Problems



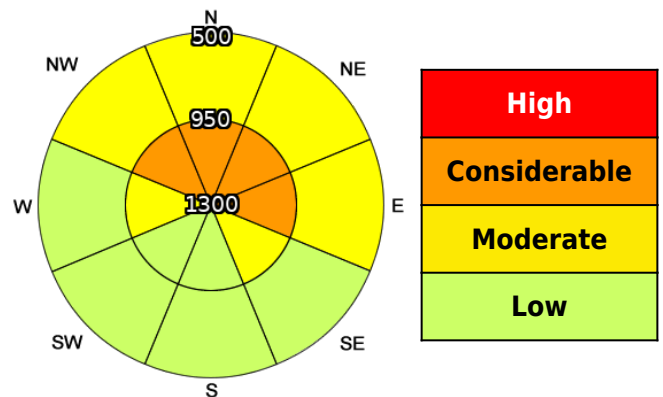
Wind Slab

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab becoming more widespread mainly above 950 metres on North-West through North to Easterly aspects, here avalanches are likely on steep and convex locations especially around corrie rims, gully tops, scarp slopes and crag aprons. Cornices will be fragile. Unstable windslab developing on other aspects due to cross loading. Localised unstable windslab will develop on steep wind sheltered banks and slopes below 950 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers mostly above 400 metres throughout the forecast period, these could be variable and localised in intensity. South-South-East winds will back to the West-South-West and continue to be strong to gale force through the day. The freezing level will fluctuate between 500 and 600 meters.

Localised variations of the frequency and intensity of snow showers.
