

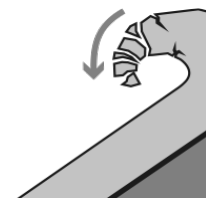

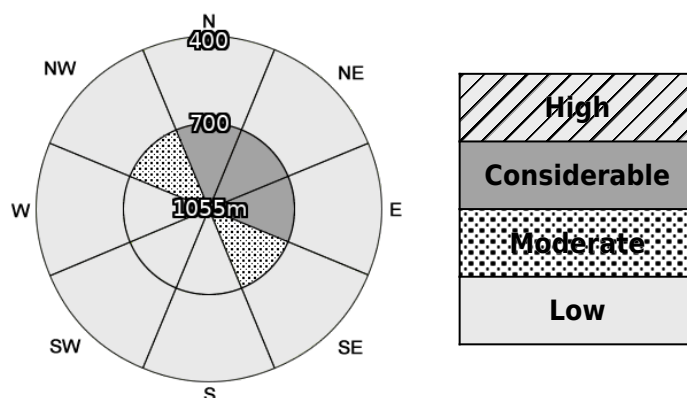

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of poorly bonded windslab will persist in steep sheltered locations, mainly North to East aspects above 700 metres. Further accumulations of windslab will build in similar areas through the period. Most affected will be coire back walls, gullies and ridge flanks and cross loading will affect North-West and South-East aspects. Cornices will remain fragile. Some wind exposed areas will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers and longer spells of snow will continue throughout the period, although becoming lighter during the day. Strong Southerly winds will ease by midnight, veering to become a fresh Westerly through the remainder of the period. The freezing level will rise to around 800 metres overnight, gradually dropping to 550 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

More of the same conditions over the next few days; periods of snow, light winds at times, windslab will persist.
