

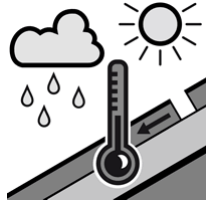

#### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 08/03/2020

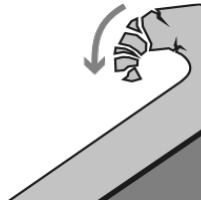

Wind Slab



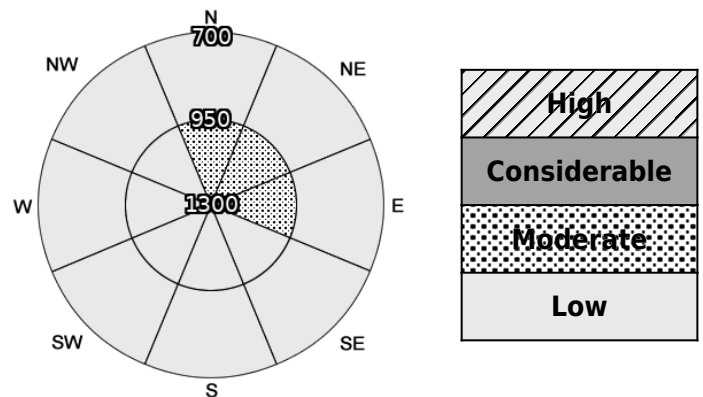

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to thaw and become more saturated during the night with the potential for some wet snow instabilities on steep North to East aspects above 1000 metres. In these areas cornices will be unstable with the potential to collapse onto slopes below. As it turns cooler the snowpack will begin to consolidate and localised windslab will develop mostly around corrie rims and gully tops on North to East aspects above 950 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Rain at all levels during the first part of the night on strong to gale force South-South-Westerly winds. As it becomes cooler rain will turn to light snow above 600 metres, this will continue through the day on strong South-Westerly winds. The freezing level will fall to 700 metres.
