

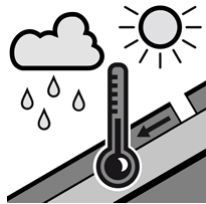

**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 08/03/2020**

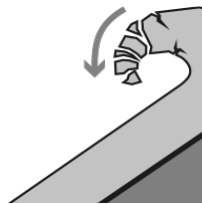

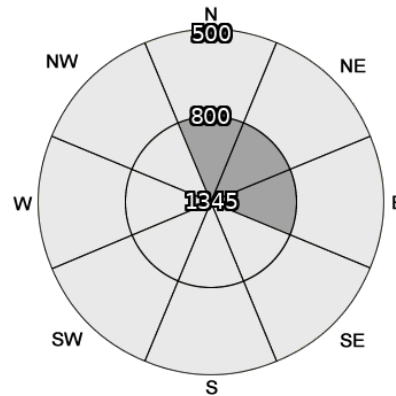

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The old wet snowpack will consolidate as the freezing level lowers. Fresh unstable windslab will form through the day mainly on North to East aspects above 800 metres, with steep wind sheltered locations such as gullies and coire rims most affected. Localised areas of windslab may be present in other wind sheltered locations due to crossloading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Strong South-Westerly winds. Heavy rain at all levels at the start of the night will gradually turn to snow showers above 700m. The freezing level will gradually lower to become 700m during the day.

**Comments**

Mainly stormy with strong Westerly winds for the next few days briefly better on Monday morning.
