#### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 09/03/2020


##### Avalanche Problems

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will continue to refreeze and be generally well bonded. Fresh localised accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will develop later in the afternoon on steep sheltered North to East aspects above 800 metres. Areas mainly affected will be corrie rims and gully exits. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Largely dry overnight and during the morning with snow expected in the afternoon. Fresh South-West winds easing overnight increasing to Strong through the day and backing South-South-East. The 700 metre freezing level will peak at 850 metres around midday before lowering to 650 metres.

##### Comments

Fluctuating freezing levels over the coming days accompanied by gales or severe gales.
