

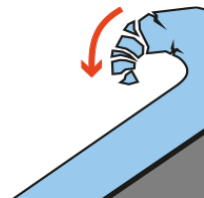

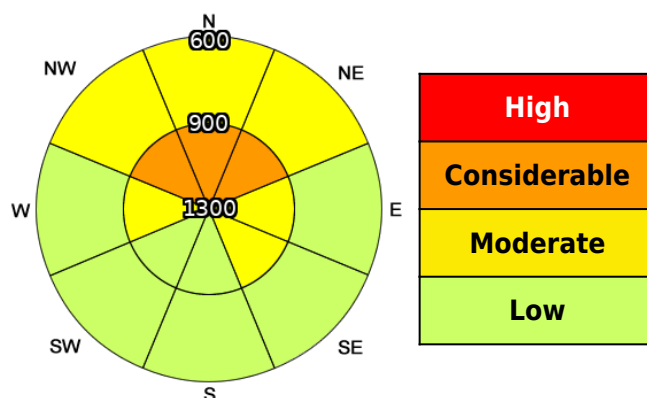
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will continue to consolidate, however instabilities will persist mainly above 1000m on steep, convex NW to NE aspects. During the day further windslab will develop with avalanches likely on these aspects mostly above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be in steep wind sheltered locations particularly around coire rims, headwalls and gully exits. Cornices will be unstable. Localised windslab developing below 900m on steep banks. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall will die out during the first part of the evening. Strong North-North-West winds will ease and back to the South-South-West overnight, increasing strong to storm force through the day. Light snowfall expected during the afternoon. Freezing to low levels overnight, steadily rising to 900 metres by the end of the day

Comments

Although dry up until mid afternoon, drifting expected throughout the day on storm force winds.
