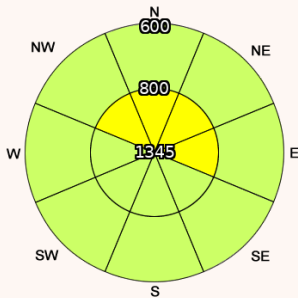


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Sun 22/03/2020 TO 18:00HRS Mon 23/03/2020



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will increase to gale force during the night, veering from South-South-East to South. There is no precipitation expected. The freezing level will rise steadily during the day.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Localised unstable windslab will remain on North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres. Elsewhere the snowpack will continue to consolidate. Large cornices will remain. Wind scoured slopes will be frozen and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Sun 22/03/2020

Observed Weather Influences

A dry and bright day. Moderate Southerly winds. The freezing level rose to 900m.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

There are localised areas of unstable windslab above 800 metres on North-West through North to East aspects. Large cornices overhang the same aspects. Elsewhere, the snowpack is well consolidated. Wind scoured slopes are frozen and icy. The avalanche hazard is Moderate.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions

Good visibility. Winds approx 10 - 20 mph. Good snow cover above 600m.

Comments

Dry conditions continue for tomorrow but with strengthening winds.
