Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain well bonded, firm and stable above 900 metres. Isolated accumulations of moderately bonded windslab are present on North to East aspects above 1000 metres. These will be redeposited onto South-East to South-West aspects above 1000 metres through the forecast period in the strengthening wind. Very steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims, scarp slopes and gully exits will be mostly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will be around 600 metres tomorrow. Precipitation is expected from mid morning, although this will be light, falling as a dusting of snow above 500 metres. Winds will be predominately from the North and will increase from moderate to strong through the day.

Comments

The colder trend continuing. Firm snow surface on most aspects, falls and slips are likely to be of serious consequence.
