

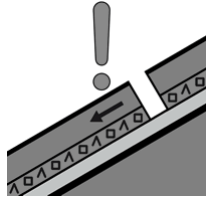

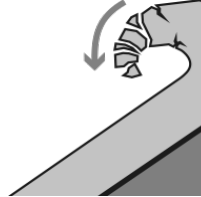

Wind Slab



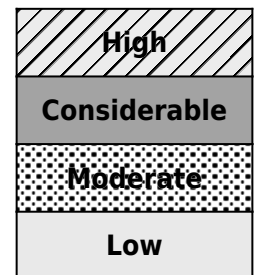
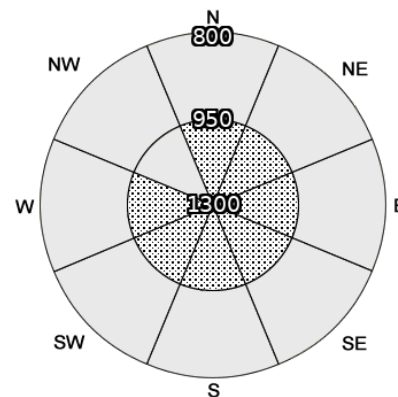

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will persist on North, through East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Weaknesses will remain in steep wind sheltered locations where these accumulations are deepest. Coire headwalls, gully tops and convex slopes will be most affected. Moderately bonded windslab will also be deposited on South to West aspects above 950 metres, as the snow is redistributed. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Precipitation will fall as snow overnight above 200 metres, with a dry day expected. The freezing level will be at 500 metres for the duration of the forecast period, although snow will continue to lie above 200 metres due to a cold airmass over the Cairngorms. The wind will be moderate and from the East backing to the North-East.
