

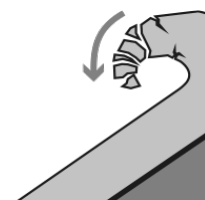

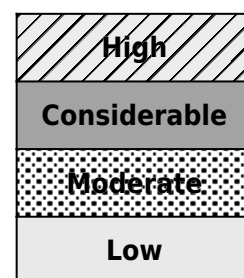
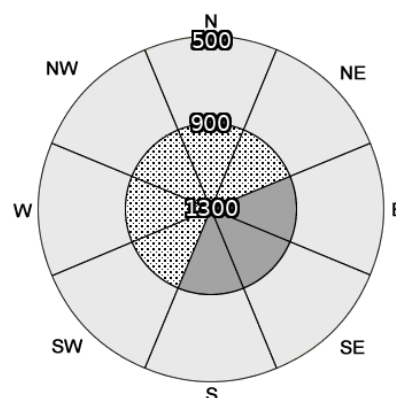

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately to weakly bonded accumulations of windslab will continue to develop on Easterly to Southerly aspects mainly above 1000 metres. Areas especially affected will be within wind sheltered steep and convex terrain. Instabilities will also be present on many other aspects above 900 metres especially where deposits have gained depth in steep terrain such as coire rims, the tops of gullies and crag aprons. Cornices will be soft and fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall is expected to clear during the night before becoming more widespread through the afternoon. Moderate to strong North-Westerly winds will back to the West-North-West. The freezing level will fluctuate between 300 and 400 metres.

Comments

A day of very poor visibility. Icy conditions beneath soft new snow continue to be a hazard on steep slopes.
