

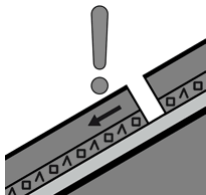

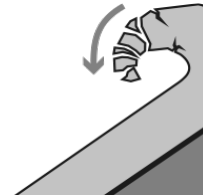

Wind Slab



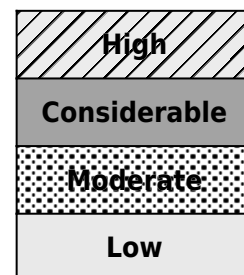
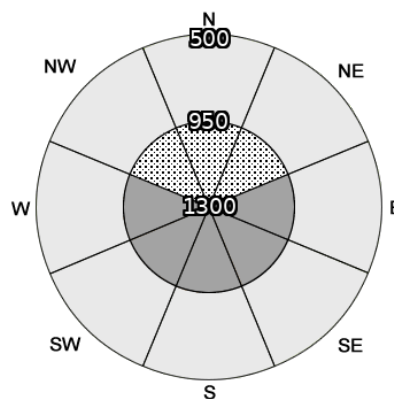

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Widespread moderately to weakly bonded windslab will persist mainly on East through South to West aspects above 950 metres, with wind sheltered steep and convex terrain most affected. Localised instabilities will also be present in the highest steep wind sheltered locations on North-West to North-East aspects; coire rims and gully tops most affected. Cornices Fragile. Below 950 metres the snowpack will continue to consolidate and be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a mainly dry day with only isolated snow showers. Winds will be moderate North-Westerly veering Northerly in the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 400 metres with summit temperatures of around -8 degrees C.
