

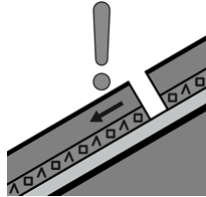

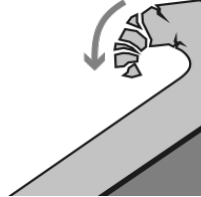

Wind Slab



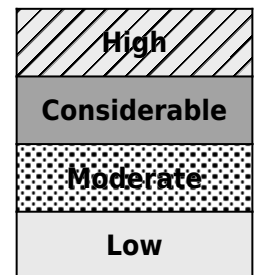
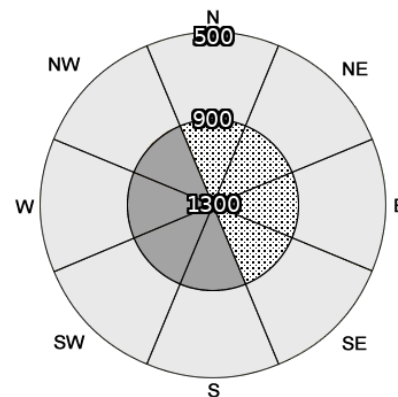
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderate to weakly bonded windslab will become more widespread on South through West to North-West aspects above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be above 1000 metres on steep wind sheltered locations such as around coire rims and gully tops. More localised instabilities will be present on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Cornices will be fragile. Some isolated instabilities on very steep banks below this altitude. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry cold conditions are expected throughout the forecast period. Moderate to strong Easterly winds will ease during the day and back to the North-East. The freezing level will be mostly around 500 metres.
