

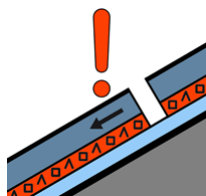

Wind Slab



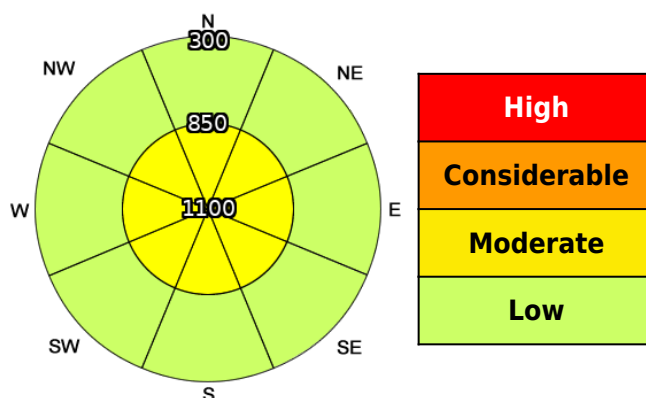
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change. At highest elevations, above 900 metres cold temperatures will maintain weaknesses in all significant old windslab accumulations. Most affected areas will be gully tops and coire rims of all aspects above 900 metres. Shallow more localised deposits of marginally bonded new windslab will exist on steeper mainly South-East through South to South-West aspects above 850 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will maintain the current dry and cold conditions. The winds initially Easterly will back East-North-East overnight, then North-Easterly, they will remain fresh with freezing all levels throughout the period.
