




Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of windslab will form mainly on sheltered North through East to South-East aspects above 800m. These new deposits will add depth to the existing weakly bonded snowpack where avalanches are likely. Areas particularly affected will be steep wind sheltered locations, gullies, steep coire headwalls, gully exits and scarp slopes. New snow instabilities will also be present on some other steeper slopes. Cornices will be soft and fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, a frost at all levels, the freezing level will be around 200 metres in the day with scattered light snow showers falling to lower levels. Winds will be moderate to fresh and mostly South-Westerly.

Remaining cold. Drier on Monday and Tuesday.
