

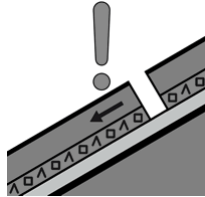

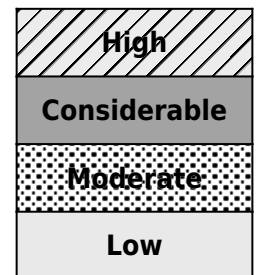
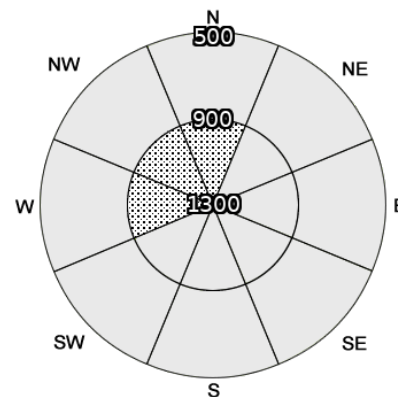
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New windslab will develop during the day on Westerly to Northerly aspects mainly above 900 metres. Greatest instability will be in steep terrain where accumulations gain significant depth. Areas most affected will be in wind sheltered locations such as around coire rims and the tops of gullies. Some instabilities will persist at depth within steep and convex locations on East to South aspects above 1000 metres but in general stability will be good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry night with moderate South-Easterly winds steadily increasing moderate to strong and backing East-South-Easterly during the afternoon. Light snowfall is expected for most of the day this will turn a little heavier through the afternoon. The 400 metre freezing level will rise to 600 metres during the day.

Comments

The snowpack has transformed over the past 24 hours due to the slightly milder temperatures and humid conditions.
