

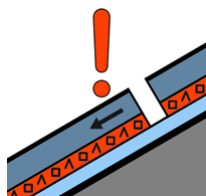

Wind Slab



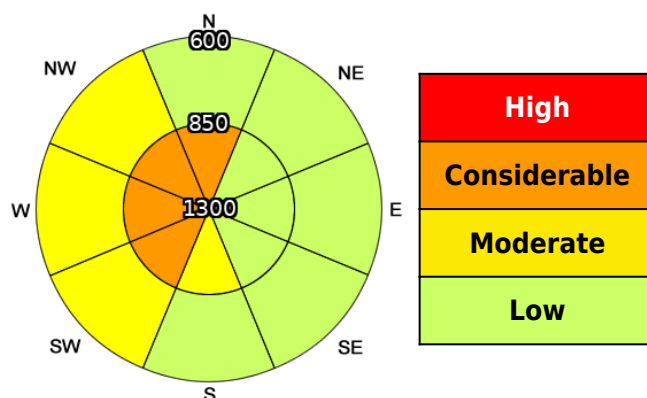
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Redistribution will cause additional windslab to accumulate on top of existing poorly bonded windslab on South-West through West to Northerly aspects above 850m, with steep and convex terrain most affected. Fragile cornices will be present above these aspects. More localised instabilities will persist on Southerly aspects and on steep slopes at lower elevations on South-West to North-West aspects. Elsewhere will be scoured with a widespread crust. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a cold dry day. Moderate South-Easterly winds will back Easterly and become light overnight then veer East-North-Easterly and increase in strength to moderate during the day. It will be freezing at all levels with a Cairngorm summit temperature of -8 degrees C.

Comments

Remaining cold with further snow forecast Monday night and Tuesday. Instabilities in snowpack will persist in colder temperatures.
