



#### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 06/02/2021



Wind Slab






##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further loading onto existing snowpack weaknesses and poorly bonded windslab will become more widespread on SW to NW aspects above 600m; here avalanches will occur. Steep and convex terrain will be especially affected. Unstable windslab on N and S aspects due to cross loading. Below 600m poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on SW to NW aspects in wind sheltered places such as steep banks, gullies and convexities. Cornices liable to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be High.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall will continue on gale force East veering East-South-East winds. The freezing level will be around 400 metres.

##### Comments

Persistent weak layers to low levels with further loading creating an unstable snowpack on lee slopes. Wind exposed slopes more stable.
