

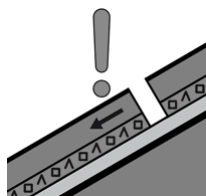

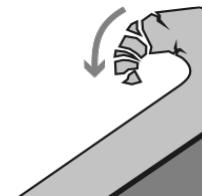

Wind Slab



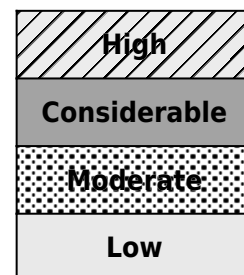
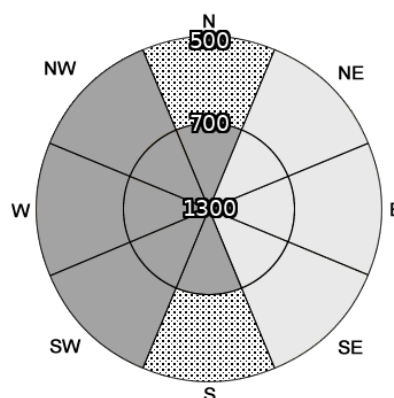

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop overlying weaknesses in the existing snowpack. SW to NW aspects above 700 metres will be mostly affected, where avalanches are likely. Above 500 metres poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on South-West to North-West aspects in wind sheltered locations such as steep banks, gullies and convexities. N and S aspects will be subject to cross loading. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Precipitation will again feature for the duration of the day. This expected to be light but will fall as snow from glen level upwards. The freezing level will be around 100 metres and winds are expected to be moderate to strong and from the East.

Comments

A delicate avalanche situation continues to prevail with persistent weak layers in windslab. Wind exposed slopes are more stable.
