

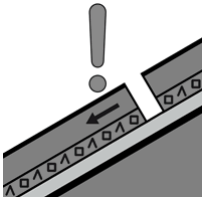

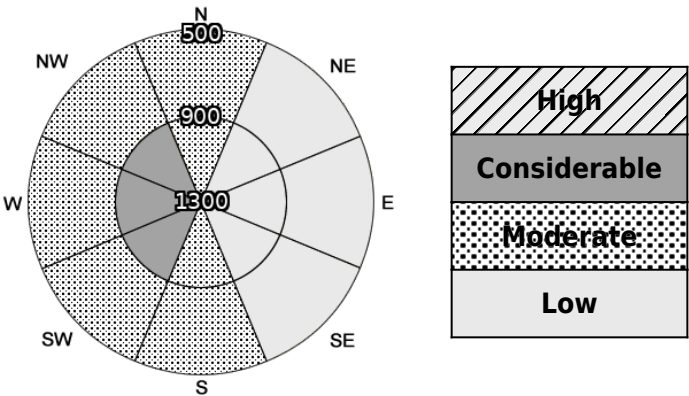
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A general steady improvement of snowpack stability; however widespread weaknesses will persist at depth above 900m but this will continue to be mostly bridged by hard windslab. Steep and convex SW to NW slopes will be most affected. On S to W to N aspects at lower elevations and above 500m instabilities will persist, mainly on steep and convex banks and gullies. Unstable windslab will develop during the afternoon on W to N aspects above 900m. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry cold conditions will continue, freezing at all levels. Light to moderate South-Easterly winds will strengthen during the afternoon.

Comments

Weak layers persist at depth in the snowpack but are mostly protected and bridged by hard windslab. Skiers and climbers can trigger this layer where the hard slab becomes thinner especially at the top of convexities.
