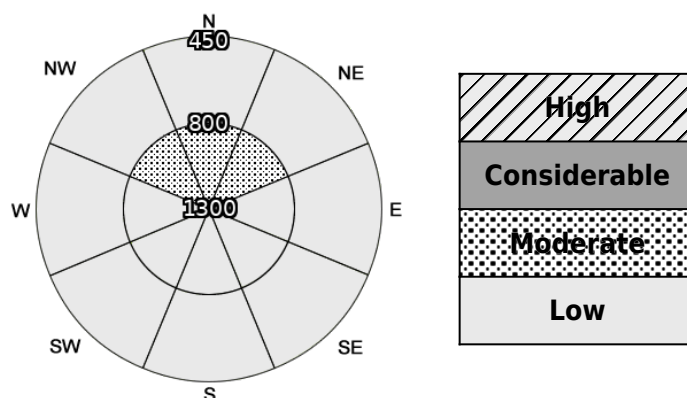
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to consolidate and be stable in most locations. Above 800 metres the snowpack will gradually refreeze in the colder temperatures. Localised, generally shallow accumulations of fresh moderately bonded windslab will form in steep wind sheltered locations on North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres. Areas specifically affected will be gully tops, coire rims and convex terrain. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be a band of showers, which will fall as snow above around 800 metres early in the morning followed by a generally dry day with only occasional snow showers. There will be a strong, mainly Southerly wind. The freezing level will be around 800 metres.
