

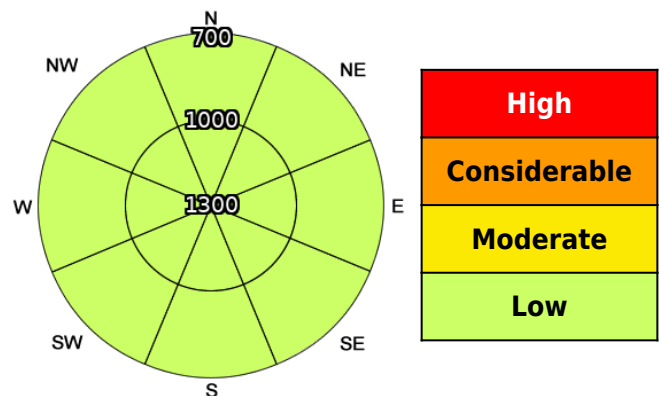

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 04/03/2021

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain well bonded and stable throughout, with little change expected. The snowpack will generally remain hard and icy at all levels. A light dusting of snow be deposited on South-East through South to Westerly aspects above 750 metres, although accumulations are expected to be small and insignificant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light winds will predominately be from the North-North-East veering to the North-East later. A band of precipitation is expected before dawn, this falling as snow initially above 750 metres. Amounts are however expected to be small. The freezing level will be around 750 metres lowering to 500 metres for the duration of daylight hours.

Comments

A hard and icy snowpack remains serious in the event of an unarrested slip or fall.
