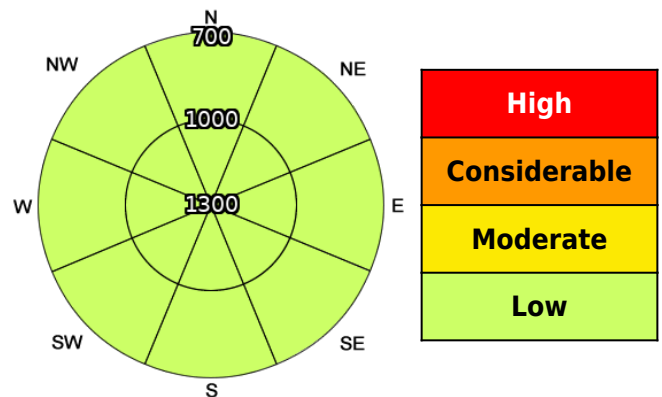
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will be firm well bonded and stable throughout, later softening at lower levels during the course of the day, the most extensive cover being above 900 metres on all aspects. New accumulations of windslab will develop mostly around coire rims above 1000 metres on Northerly to Easterly aspects, but these will be shallow and generally avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light rain and summit snow is expected mainly during the day on moderate to strong West-South-Westerly winds. The 700 metre freezing level will steadily rise through the night to reach summit levels by midday.

Comments

The snowpack will remain firm with serious runout potential below.
