

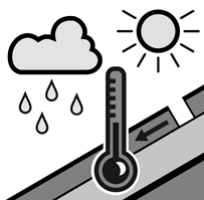

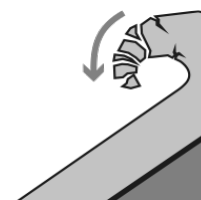

Wind Slab



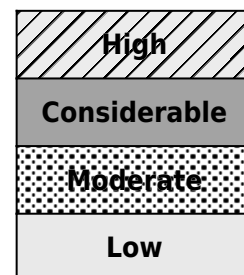
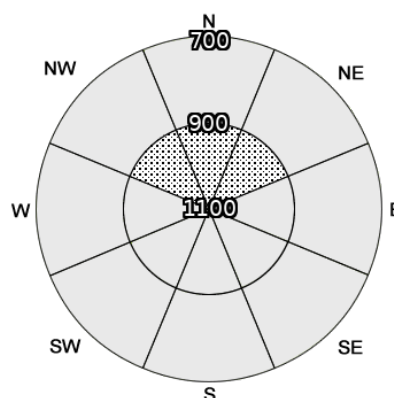

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of new poorly bonded windslab will develop overnight above 800 metres in high sheltered locations. Stability will deteriorate as the day progresses where these accumulations achieve depth in steep gully flanks and exits. Areas affected will primarily be on NW through N to NE aspects above 900 metres. Some new fragile cornice development around coire rims of these aspects is also likely. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Persistent rain overnight will turn to snow above 700 metres as a series of active fronts affect the area. The freezing level will rise again by the end of the day, to above summit level. Storm force Southerly winds will ease only a little and become South-South West, then South-South East.
