

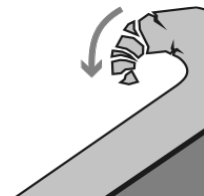

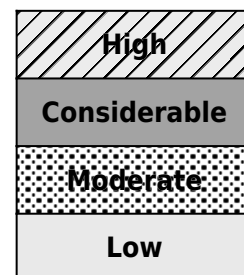
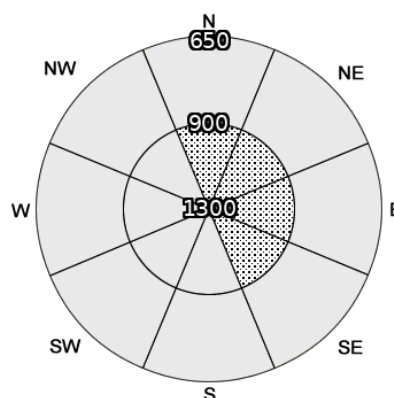
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations of unstable windslab will continue to develop and gain depth in wind sheltered locations on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Convex terrain, gully tops and coire rims will be most affected. Fresh cornices above these aspects will be fragile. Deposits of fresh snow will also be present at lower levels on banks, hollows and stream beds. Elsewhere the snowpack will be firm, icy and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a mainly dry day with occasional showers during the night and again towards the end of the afternoon, these will fall as snow above 600 metres. The freezing level will be around 600 metres. Winds will be strong South-Westerly overnight veering Westerly and remaining strong during the day.

Comments

Remaining cold for the weekend. Many areas remain firm and icy, a slip or fall in these areas would have serious consequences.
