

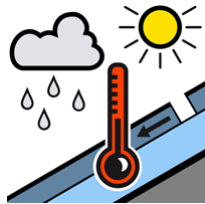

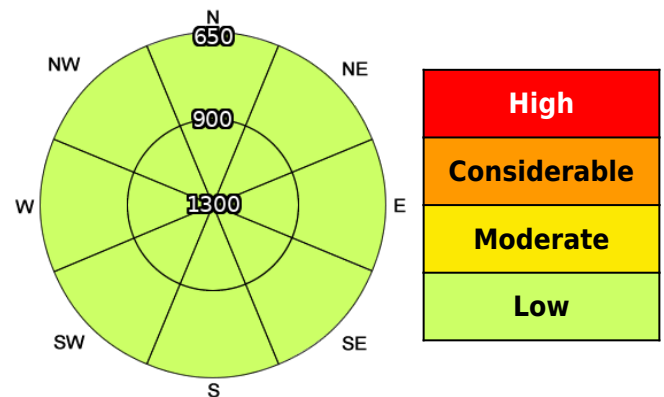
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain well bonded and stable throughout and will be most widespread on all aspects above 900 metres. Isolated accumulations of windslab will continue to develop mainly around coire rims on North to East aspects above 900 metres but these will be shallow and generally avoidable. As it turns milder isolated surface instabilities will develop on steep North to East aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very light snow showers throughout the forecast period on strong to gale force West-South-West backing South-South-Westerly winds. During the afternoon there will be a spell of light rain at the highest levels as the 900 metre freezing level rises towards the summits.

Comments

Very firm conditions with serious run out potential on steep slopes.
