

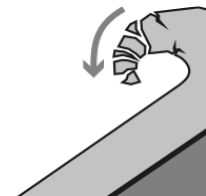

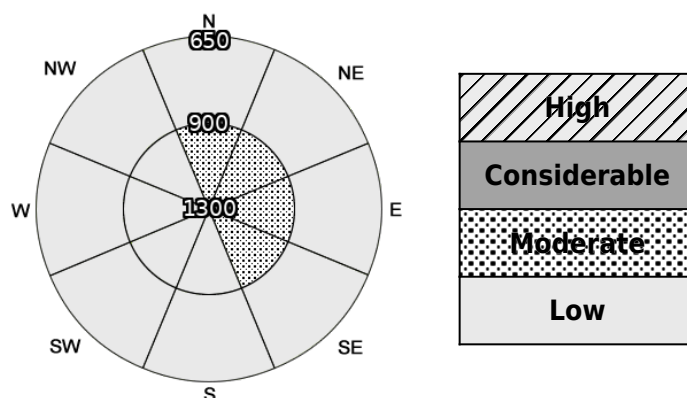
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will continue to develop on North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Areas particularly affected will be crag aprons, coire rims, headwalls and gullies. Cornices will also develop above slopes of these aspects. Outwith these areas the snowpack will be firm, well bonded and stable especially on wind exposed slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light showers are expected at times overnight and in the morning before a generally dry afternoon. These will fall as snow above 300 metres initially. The freezing level will be around 300 metres rising to 600 metres by the end of the forecast period. Winds will be generally strong from the West backing to the South-South-West later.

Comments

The snowpack will remain scoured and firm on wind exposed slopes. Serious consequences in the event of a slip or fall.
