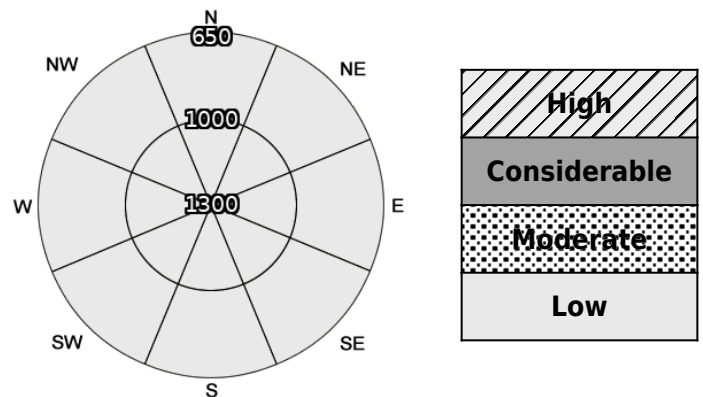
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain well bonded and stable throughout, becoming firmer during the day. New accumulations of windslab will develop on South to West aspects above 950 metres. These will be mostly isolated, avoidable and confined to sheltered locations such as around coire rims and the tops of gullies. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

During the night there will be rain at all levels. Gale force South-Westerly winds will ease through the night and veer, becoming Northerly. Gradually turning cooler through the morning with rain turning to sleet then snow above 800 metres on moderate to strong North-West winds. The freezing level will steadily fall to 800 metres by the afternoon.

Comments

The snowpack will begin to firm up during the day with serious run out potential developing on steep slopes.
