

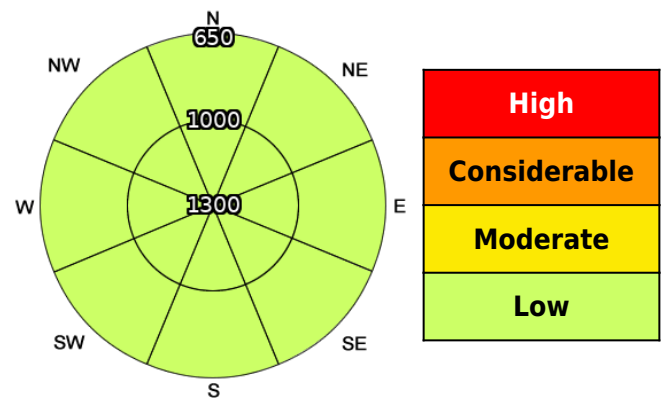

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 01/04/2021

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will become much firmer in the cooler temperatures and remain well bonded and stable in all locations. Greatest amounts are to be found above 950 metres on all aspects mainly around coire back walls and plateau areas. Recently developed windslab accumulations lying on South to West aspects, above 950 metres will be shallow and generally avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall will clear overnight and it will be dry for the remainder of the forecast period. Moderate winds will ease to light and be mainly North-Easterly in direction. The freezing level will lower to 500 metres, later rising towards summit levels and above later in the day.

Comments

High pressure developing. The snowpack will become much firmer with serious run out potential on steep slopes.
