

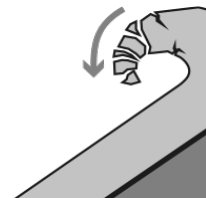

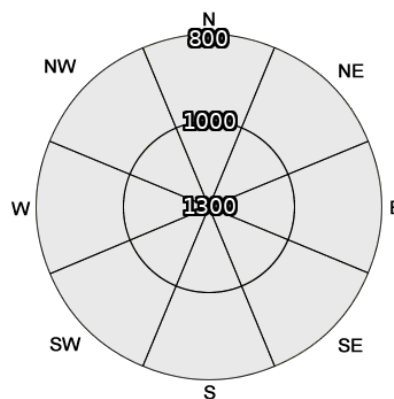

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain firm, icy and stable in all locations following an overnight freeze. Localised deposits of poorly bonded windslab will accumulate on North to East aspects above 1000 metres as the afternoon progresses. Steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims, scarp slopes and gully tops will be affected. Small, fragile cornices will develop above the same aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

An approaching cold front will herald a change in the weather with snow falling in the afternoon. This is expected to fall above 1000 metres initially, reaching 600 metres by the end of the forecast period. Correspondingly, the freezing level will be around 1000 metres during the day dropping to 600 metres later. Winds will quickly build from gale to storm force from the West-South-West.
