

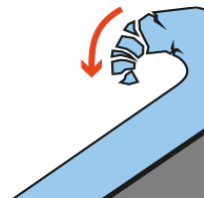

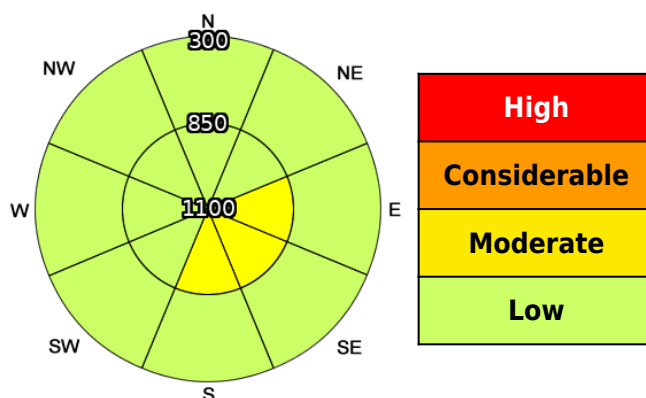
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will be present in sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will be on East to South aspects above 850 metres. Fresh fragile cornices will be present above these aspects. The old snowpack will be frozen at all levels and will be stable throughout. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Wind will initially be strong North-North-Westerly this evening, then back becoming North-Westerly and ease to moderate overnight. The period is expected to be mainly dry, though a few isolated light snow showers are possible overnight. It will remain freezing at all levels for most of the period, rising to around 500 metres during the afternoon.

Comments

Remaining unusually cold and snowy for April.
