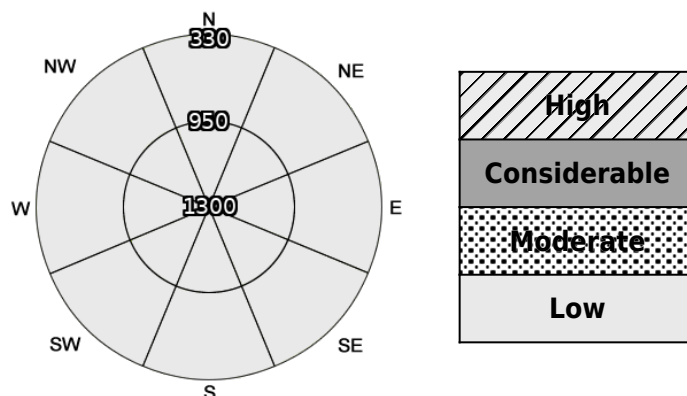


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 12/04/2021****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Windslab will continue to develop in steep wind sheltered locations such as corrie rims, gully tops and convexities on North-East through East to Southerly aspects above 950 metres. These accumulations will be isolated, shallow and generally avoidable. Outwith these areas the snowpack will be firm, well bonded and stable with a thin covering of new snow in many locations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will remain cold at all elevations before the freezing level rises to 800 metres during the day. A dry and sunny day is expected with moderate winds generally from the North-West veering to the North briefly around midday.

Comments

Very firm snow ice sometimes obscured by a thin veneer of fresh snow. Consequential in the event of a slip or fall with serious runouts into the terrain below.
