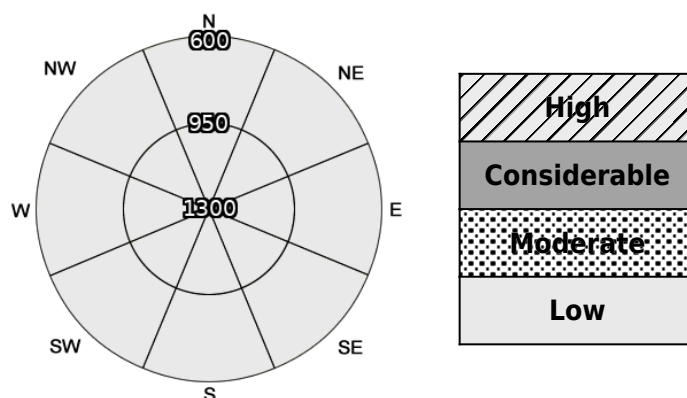
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. Isolated windslab will remain in steep wind sheltered locations on North-East through East to Southerly aspects above 950 metres. Coire rims, gully tops and convexities are typical examples. Outwith these areas the snowpack will be firm, well bonded and stable with a thin covering of new snow in many locations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold at all elevations before the freezing level rises to around 700 metres by the end of the day. A dry and sunny day is expected with light winds mostly from the North-West.

Comments

The snow pack will remain firm and sometimes disguised by a fresh dusting of new snow. Consequential in the event of a slide or fall.
