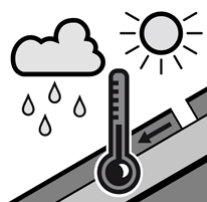

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 14/04/2021

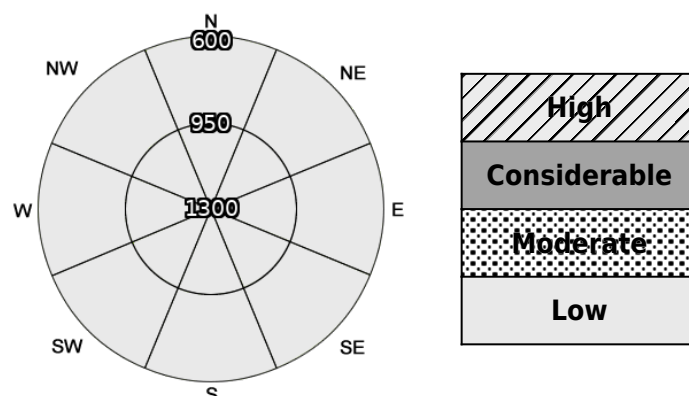
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable, firm in most locations gradually softening where exposed to the sun. Isolated shallow wet snow instabilities possible on very steep East to South aspects above 950 metres when exposed to the strong sunlight. Greatest snow cover above 950 metres, very patchy below. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a dry day with early morning cloud dispersing to give a sunny day. Winds will be light and variable. The freezing level will be around 700 metres overnight rising to 1200 metres during the day.

Comments

Snow will remain firm in many locations with serious run outs on some steep slopes.
