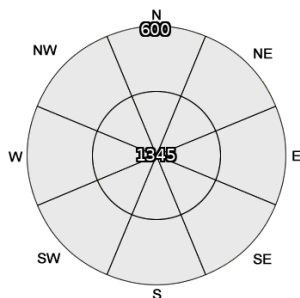


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Thu 25/11/2021 TO 18:00HRS Fri 26/11/2021



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

There will be a brief thaw overnight with rain at most altitudes. Friday will see a return to colder conditions and snow showers above 400m. Winds will be strong from the North-West

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The existing covering of snow will thaw overnight before fresh snow starts to accumulate during Friday. Accumulations are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Thu 25/11/2021

Observed Weather Influences

A generally dry morning with some light snow flurries. Freezing level around around 500m. Light North-Westerly winds

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

There is a light covering of fresh snow above 600m, which becomes slightly deeper at higher altitudes. There are no significant accumulations. The avalanche hazard is Low

A cold day with light winds. Shallow fresh snow underfoot
