




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of windslab will continue to build on South-East to South-West aspects above 900 metres. These instabilities are expected to be localised, affecting steeper wind sheltered locations such as corrie rims, convexities and gully exits. Pockets of cross loaded windslab may be present on East and West aspects above 900 metres. Fragile cornices will continue to develop. Elsewhere, a dusting of snow will remain on bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong North-North-West winds backing through West to West-South-West easing to moderate by the end of the forecast period. Very light snow showers expected. Freezing level around 400 metres.

Comments

It very much felt like winter today with challenging underfoot conditions, poor visibility and severe windchill.
