

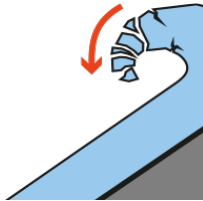

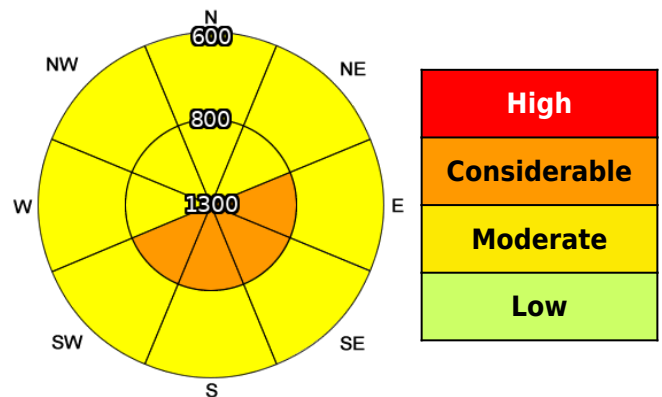

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow forming weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop on E through S to SW aspects above 800m. The most widespread accumulations will form in steep wind sheltered locations especially the tops of gullies, crag aprons and coire rims; here avalanches are likely. Localised instabilities will also affect steep banks on these aspects below 800m. Fragile cornices! W through N to NE aspects will be affected by cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers will continue throughout the forecast period. Gale force North-North-Westerly winds will gradually ease through the day to become light Southerly by the end of the day. The 500 metre freezing level will rise to 700 metres.

Comments

Significantly more snow arrived than was originally forecast. It is important to consider weather and any developing conditions during the day as this relates to the avalanche Hazard.
