
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be wet and thawing at all levels through the day. Wet snow instabilities will develop in pockets of recent windslab that exist on steep sheltered terrain, North to East aspects, mainly above 850 metres, but are not expected to be significant. Otherwise, the general snowpack will remain stable throughout. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light wintry showers overnight will give way to rain, preceded by summit sleet and snow, at all levels through the day, heaviest in the morning. The fresh South-West wind will gradually strengthen, becoming gale force by daybreak. The freezing level will rise from 750 metres overnight to well above the summits by same time.

Comments

Yet another very mild period approaches that looks set to last a few days. Expect some more snow loss, especially at lower elevations.
