
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Tue 21/12/2021 TO 18:00HRS Wed 22/12/2021



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will remain above the summits. It will mostly be dry, however, some light precipitation likely in the afternoon falling as freezing rain or sleet/snow mainly above 900 metres. The South-Easterly winds will strengthen through the day backing to be East-South-Easterly.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

New snow amounts are not expected to be significant, mainly a dusting above 900 metres. The existing old snowpack will remain well bonded, firm, and often icy which exists mainly on North to Easterly aspects above 850 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Tue 21/12/2021

Observed Weather Influences

Again, it was dry and calm, misty at lower elevations, frosty and cold at mid mountain height, clear and bright over the higher summits. Winds were very light from a Southerly direction.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack remains firm and well bonded in all locations and at all elevations. The avalanche hazard is Low.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	The snowpack is limited but well bonded which mainly exists above 850 metres on N to E aspects. Poor visibility below 700 metres clear above this altitude, very light Southerly winds.
Comments	Paths and rocks are still likely to be icy. Some doubt as to the timing of tomorrow's precipitation it could arrive early evening.
