


## THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 22/12/2021

#### Avalanche Problems

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The remaining snow will be very firm well bonded and stable throughout. The snow cover will be patchy in most locations with largest areas above 900 metres in gullies, around coire rims and high summit plateau areas. Any new snow amounts are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

It will be dry and cloudy for most of the day with summit temperatures around 0 degrees Celsius. Some light precipitation falling as snow above 950 metres towards the end of the afternoon. Winds will be light South-South-Westerly backing to become Southerly and increasing to moderate by midday.

#### Comments

Remaining snow very firm and icy in all locations, serious run out potential below all steep slopes. Some uncertainty of timing of new snow, may not arrive until evening.
