


## THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 23/12/2021

#### Avalanche Problems

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected in the existing snowpack, which will remain hard, well bonded and stable throughout. A few minor pockets of windslab may accumulate on West to North facing slopes above 1000m, but this is expected to be minimal and easily avoidable. Snow cover is patchy, greatest amounts remain on steep north facing aspects above 1000m and on a range of aspects on the high plateau areas. The avalanche hazard will be Low



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be from the South during the evening, backing Easterly through the forecast period and increasing from light to moderate strength during daylight hours. A mixture of rain, freezing rain, sleet and snow is expected. The freezing level will be on or above summit level.

#### Comments

Remaining snow patches are EXTREMELY hard and icy, with very consequential run outs. Underfoot conditions below 800m remain very frozen and icy.
