

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Slopes will remain extensively scoured, icy and with a thin dusting of snow. However, accumulations of very weakly bonded windslab will continue to build in isolated areas. Steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims, gully tops and scarp slopes of a North-West and North aspect above 800 metres will be affected. West and North-East aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Fragile cornices are also present. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be precipitation overnight falling as snow above 600 metres, although quantities are expected to be small. During daylight hours a dry day is expected with a freezing level of around 800 metres. Winds will be from the South-South-East, veering Easterly and easing to become moderate in strength.

Comments

Although windslab accumulations are isolated in extent, where present they are very weakly bonded and easily triggered. Caution advised as we enter a spell of calmer weather tomorrow.
