
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snow will remain generally stable. Isolated accumulations of unstable windslab will develop overnight mainly on West to North aspects above 900 metres with features such as gully exits and corrie rims most affected. These are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-East winds ease through the night to become moderate during the day. Occasional light showers overnight falling as snow above 800 metres followed by a dry day. The freezing level will be around 900 metres.

Comments

Dry, with light to moderate winds on Monday and Tuesday followed by stronger winds, precipitation and rising temperatures on Wednesday.
