




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow and wind transport of existing deposits will form localised areas of unstable windslab in wind sheltered locations mainly on North-West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 850 metres. Gully exits, corrie headwalls and areas where older hard snow exist will be most affected. Fresh cornices will be fragile. The patchy older snowpack will remain stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

New snow on the higher slopes through the day and strong generally Southerly winds will affect the area. The freezing level will initially be around 400 metres rising to 1000 metres in the afternoon before falling to 600 metres by evening.

Comments

Localised hazard expected mainly areas where older re-frozen snow underlies fresh windslab.
